On October 17, 2024, credit union members around the world will celebrate International Credit Union Day®, an annual event to commemorate the credit union movement's impact and achievements. This year marks the 76th anniversary of this annual event, which will be celebrated under the theme of "One World Through Cooperative Finance." In honor of this special day, Katahdin Federal Credit Union invites its members and the entire community to join us from 11:00-1:00 at the Millinocket office for refreshments and door prizes.

Credit unions are not-for-profit financial cooperatives that provide an effective and viable alternative to for-profit financial institutions for more than 403 million members in 98 countries worldwide. More than 82,000 credit unions exist globally, providing a plethora of financial services for their members, recognized as a force for positive economic and social change.

Since 1948, International Credit Union Day® has been celebrated annually on the third Thursday of October. Each year, the international event affords the opportunity to remember credit unions' proud history and promote awareness of and support for the credit union and financial cooperative difference.

Holiday Savings

Have you ever heard anyone say "I wish I hadn't saved for the holidays"? I don't think so! Holiday Clubs are the most convenient way to save for the holidays and other seasonal expenses. If you don't have a Club account, you can open one online using the online portal or visit one of our tellers. You can then set up an electronic transfer so deposits are conveniently made. Holiday Clubs are setup to accept deposits all year but are not designed for frequent withdrawals. An automatic transfer will take place in October, just in time for the holiday shopping season! If you plan on making withdrawals during the year, an alternative Club account may be the answer for you. Alternative Clubs do not automatically transfer and remain in the account.

This year, Holiday Club funds will transfer to your main share account on October 15, 2024 (unless you have chosen an alternative share account). The new holiday clubs will begin on October 16, 2024. If your holiday club is currently set up on an electronic funds transfer (EFT), you are all set—your club will restart automatically.
